Program Description

This program will give you an overview of Perak, first day of the week will explore the historical town of Taiping. You will visit Kuala Kangsar the royal town of Perak, visiting one of the traditional palaces and a gallery showcasing the royal artifacts. You will visit Ipoh, capital of Perak, which was named as the 6th best in Asia by Lonely Planet in 2016. You will also visit Han Chin Pet Soo Museum which showcases the old day lifestyle during tin mining under British Colony. After that you will visit train station, one of the most beautiful stations built more than 100 years ago by the British. On the final day, you will set off to Kuala Sepetang, which is a coastal town located in Pera. It is a thriving fishing village, and the main jumping-off point to the river mouth community of Kuala Sangga. The Port Weld railway station was located at the centre of town.

Aims & Objectives

The aim & objective is to get familiar with the local cultures and customs before commencement of your community engagement project.

Schedule

Monday

In the morning after having breakfast, you will be participating in the orientation program where you learn about Taiping and Do(s) & Don't(s) during your stay here. On this tour, you will get to know the neighborhood and where the local supermarkets, ATMs, Banks and laundries are.

After that you will visit a museum and the Taiping Lake Garden in the historical town Taiping. After you return from your excursion in Taiping, you will join a Bahasa class where you will get a basic knowledge about the local language which will help you to communicate with the local people while you are in Malaysia.

Tuesday

After the breakfast you will visit Kuala Kangsar, the Royal Town of Perak. This is the town where the Royal Family of Perak resides. There you will visit the Gallery Sultan Azlan Shah. This gallery building was originally built in 1898 and completed in 1903 to be used as the residence

of Perak Sultan Idris Shah I which provides an insight of Royal Family. In the evening you will visit the local market in Kuala Kangsar.

Wednesday

After having the breakfast you will visit Ipoh, capital of Perak. Perak was named as the 6th best place in Asia by Lonely Planet in 2016. You will also visit Han Chin Pet Soo Museum which showcases the old day lifestyle during tin mining under British Colony. After that you will visit train station, one of the most beautiful stations built more than 100 years ago by the British.

Thursday

Penang has long served as the link between Asia's great kingdoms and an important outlet to the markets of Europe and the Middle East. At its heart is diverse, cosmopolitan George Town, Penang Island's main city and an urban centre that delivers old world Asia in spades; think trishaws pedalling past watermarked Chinese shophouses and blue joss smoke perfuming the air. The freshest aspects of modern culture are present, too, in an exceptional art scene and free-spirited carnivals, all fed by an infectious local enthusiasm for Penang's long history and kaleidoscope of cultures.

The places you will visit during your visit to Penang are as below,

Friday

After breakfast, you will set off to Kuala Sepetang, which is a coastal town located in Pera. It is a thriving fishing village, and the main jumping-off point to the river mouth community of Kuala Sangga, which is a Chinese fishing community at the river mouth. The Port Weld railway station was located at the centre of town. The whole railway line from here to Taiping, which was the first railway line in the Peninsular, is now dismantled, and now only the ticketing booth and the Port Weld railway signboard remain. After visiting these sites, you will return to your accommodation for a well deserved rest.

This schedule can be changed and/or amended depending on weather conditions, local conditions and unforeseen circumstances.
